



HOW DO WE MEASURE IMPACT?

Guitars Over Guns mentees complete biannual surveys using Hello Insight, a nationally recognized platform that helps youth development programs evaluate and respond to the needs of their young people. In these surveys, mentees self-report their growth across six Positive Youth Development (PYD) pillars, including the ability to engage authentically and manage their goals. We also ask them to list the number of supportive adults in their lives who believe in them, broaden their interests, and challenge them to grow artistically, emotionally, and academically.

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LETTER FROM THE CEO

To our village:

This has been a year of tremendous growth, resilience, and reflection. We overhauled our methodology, launched GOGO New York, celebrated 10 years in Chicago, broke a new ceiling on government funding, brought on 12 new full-time staff positions, developed an alumni program, built our teaching artis corps to over 100, fought through state budget cuts and hurricanes, and set our course to some of the most ambitious plans we've made to date.

Despite the national and global uncertainty afoot as we step into new challenges, I've never been more grateful, nor more confident. Budget cuts, the unsustainable rise in cost of living, global unrest, an election year... all reasons that would justify worry. But we have an incredible team, an incredible mission, an incredible track record, and an incredible community that surrounds this work.

In many ways, this moment feels like a point of arrival—and let me say, I fully appreciate the moment we are in and what it took to get here—but it really feels like a new beginning because we are just getting started. The vision for the future is big. And it's beautiful.

Now more than ever, we need to recognize that the arts are a fundamental part of our humanity. They are our vehicle for connection and for expressing ourselves, for sharing our lived experience, for understanding others' lived experience, for holding space for conversations that otherwise we aren't willing to have. The arts challenge us, they make us uncomfortable, they shape and are shaped by civil discourse, and they strengthen our democracy and society.

But what happens when we put the arts, this incredible power, in the hands of a young person? The results are magic; always unexpected but never a surprise. That is everything. That is GOGO's mission, but it's all of our responsibility. It takes all of us.

We're holding our heads high into this year of growth, challenges and all, guided by our values and by our students' voices. I couldn't be more grateful to be standing alongside each and every one of you in this work. Whatever the year brings, we'll grow through it, together.





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THE GOGO ALUMNI PROGRAM

In January 2024 we welcomed our first Alumni Engagement Coordinator, Isaiah "Zaya" Walker, onto our full-time staff. The addition of this position is a major move for us to better support our young people. Zaya works with students to support job readiness, college prep, budgeting, and navigating transitions after high school.





STUDENT ASSESSMENT SURVEY

After connecting with students and mentors, we launched the first Student Assessment Survey to gauge interest in college and careers. The insights gathered were used to develop GOGO Pathways, which expose students to diverse career options within and beyond the music industry.

The survey uncovered two key observations:

COLLEGE ASPIRATIONS VS. SCHOOL ENJOYMENT:

All students expressed a desire to attend college, even though only half reported that they liked school. This indicates that while students may not find school enjoyable, they still value the role of college in advancing their careers. At GOGO, we want to make sure that our students not only feel comfortable navigating their journey toward college, but that they also look forward to school and feel excited to attend their classes and GOGO sessions.

• CAREER INTERESTS:

Students showed a strong interest in music and the arts, with 75% interested in pursuing a music career. The remaining 25% expressed interest in fields such as science, visual arts, and law.

GOGO PATHWAYS

Utilizing data from the Student Assessment Survey and insights from over 40 individual student interviews, we're excited that GOGO Pathways is officially ready for launch. **GOGO Pathways** is a roadmap of six career fields that Guitars Over Guns students are not only interested in, but may already be on the path to achieving, thanks to the guidance of their GOGO mentor.

RECORDING/ENGINEERING:

This pathway focuses on the technical and artistic aspects of recording music.

SONGWRITING AND COMPOSING:

This pathway explores the art of songwriting, composition, and arrangement.

AUDIO AND VISUAL DESIGN:

This pathway emphasizes the integration of audio and visual elements in multimedia projects.

INTRODUCING "THE ROLODEX": YOUR KEY TO GOGO PATHWAYS

This year we're thrilled to launch "The Rolodex"—a valuable directory of professionals ready to share their expertise and insights within GOGO Pathways. This resource will connect youth with leaders across various fields, offering guidance, advice, and networking opportunities.

Our vision for GOGO Pathways is to provide career development and create a comprehensive ecosystem where students are connected to hands-on initiatives and real-world opportunities.

GOGO PIPELINE—WHERE WE'RE HEADED

We envision a "pipeline" that allows GOGO students to flow from their very first time holding an instrument, all the way through a comprehensive program designed to provide high school alumni with a structured pathway for continued engagement and career development. This initiative focuses on helping alumni build essential career skills and access exclusive internship opportunities within the organization. We can't wait to see what our alumni achieve!

MUSIC PROFESSIONAL:

This pathway is dedicated to students pursuing professional music careers as DJs, instrumentalists, or vocalists.

• BEHIND THE MUSIC:

This pathway delves into the broader aspects of the music business, exposing students to marketing, PR, tour management, and more.

• FUTURE GOGO:

Dedicated to students who aspire to be a mentor or staff member within GOGO. We are proud that we already have a cohort of former mentees who have returned to GOGO to mentor the next generation!

GUITARS OVER GUNS

FROM STUDIO TO SCREEN

This year, students across 19 Miami-Dade schools and GOGO's communitybased programs banded together for our annual music video project. Mentors and staff cultivated a nurturing environment for students from all walks of life, from Homestead to Miami Gardens and everywhere in between, to come together and create a professionally produced music video. Empowered by the themes of culture, community, and mental health, student artists created a mashup of "All My Life" and "Free Mind." From crafting original lyrics in various languages to incorporating multiple music genres like salsa and trap, students enthusiastically explored the intersection between culture and the arts. In addition, the video's focus on mental health reflects GOGO's impact as a support system for students. Creative Director J. Howard recounted an anecdote about how staff transformed a student performer's nerves on filming day into a learning experience for all. By normalizing mental health struggles and encouraging the GOGO community to seek support in one another, staff reassured the performer and she confidently shined in the following takes.

Recording at the Papa Keith Music & Media Studio, GOGO's community-based recording studio housed at Gwen Cherry Park, enhanced production quality and deepened the music video's fusion of its culture and mental health themes. The professional recording space and talents of onsite staff facilitated an atmosphere where students felt like true pop stars. J. Howard describes the feeling of bringing so many talents into one cohesive project as "phenomenal... Everyone was all hands on deck, which speaks to the organization as a whole." He explains that the music video amplifies the uplifting nature of the Guitars over Guns community, a culture of its own that inspires artists of all ages to positively support one another.

GRAD JAM

In May, we hosted our second South Miami-Dade showcase, known as Grad Jam, an unforgettable event presented in partnership with Miami Dade College Homestead and Cristina's Academy. During the event, Miami Dade College Homestead offered tours of their campus and food trucks were sponsored by Cristina's Academy. NEW SITES WHERE STUDENTS SHINE IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY



In developing new parks and school partnerships, Guitars Over Guns is able to reach more students across South Florida. This school year, GOGO is expanding to over five Miami-Dade County-run parks and four local public schools in South Miami-Dade.

The parks programs began with the launch of GOGO Studio Homestead at Live Like Bella Park. Following the studio's success as a hub for community engagement, GOGO partnered with the Miami-Dade County Department of Parks, Recreation & Open Spaces as a subcontractor dedicated to delivering dynamic parks programming with The Children's Trust and Fit to Lead.

Together with Miami-Dade County Parks and Gwen Cherry Park Foundation, GOGO then partnered with radio personality and youth advocate Papa Keith to open the Papa Keith Music & Media Studio at Gwen Cherry Park. This vibrant studio space fosters a community of creative individuals through weekly scheduled classes with music and wellness mentors. Recently, students were further inspired to embrace their artistry by recording an original album and participating in the annual GOGO music video, which was both recorded and filmed on location.



This year's school and parks expansion furthers GOGO's impact as a hub for free music and arts education. As one of the architects of the South Dade Arts Access Alliance, expanding our footprint to four new schools in the Homestead area provides more opportunities for youth in South Miami-Dade County to access quality arts education. While parks programs offer specialized open enrollment opportunities and an individualized and flexible learning track, school locations offer a more defined curriculum highlighted by a closing showcase. By engaging in either program, GOGO inspires and instills confidence among the youth of tomorrow.

GOGO Studio Homestead has been the home away from home for our South Dade student and alumni ambassador band, The Atomic Lollipops. The Lollipops have been hired by numerous organizations to perform live across the community, and recently won first place in the Best Group/Musical Instruments category of the Young Talent Big Dreams competition!

C-MAJOR'S CLIMB UP THE SCALE

C-Major, the vibrant student band from Lake Stevens Middle School, has been wowing audiences with their unique fusion of classic hits and original rap verses. Made up of 6th to 8th grade students, along with a few high schoolers, C-Major puts a fresh spin on songs like "Hit the Road, Jack" and "Ordinary People," while also showcasing their own original music.

Throughout the year, they've performed at major Miami events, including the Miami Gardens Youth Music Festival and Papa Keith's Family Fun Day, even playing for audiences that included Board of County Commissioners Chairman Oliver Gilbert III. Their mentors, Kaley Howard and Tim LaRoque,

have been instrumental in their journey, nurturing both their musical talents and leadership skills.

Kaley shared, "We planted a seed three years ago at Lake Stevens, and we're all watching it grow beautifully—both musically and characteristically." Tim added, "C-Major doesn't just play music—they tell their stories and inspire others." C-Major's journey is a true testament to the power of community, and we're deeply grateful to the Arts Access Miami Fund and Miami Gardens Arts Access Alliance for their unwavering support of our young people, helping us bring the magic of music to Miami Gardens, South Miami-Dade, and beyond.

Michelle "MJ" Donnelly is a dynamic singer, rapper, and songwriter from Harlem, New York City, who began her journey with Guitars Over Guns as a vocal and songwriting mentor. Her artistic passion was nurtured early through diverse cultural experiences in ballet, dance, and chorus. As a teenager, she studied vocals and music production as a peer mentor with the Harlem Children's Zone. MJ has performed in the underground music scenes of New York and Miami, and her latest projects include collaborations with community activists to raise awareness about social causes such as prison reform and LGBT support. After managing social media for nearly three years, MJ joined the Guitars Over Guns staff as Social Media & Content Manager, where she aims to continue amplifying the voices of communities nationwide. "Community is everything to me. If I can change one person's perspective for the better, I know I've made progress—because that person will share that perspective with others. The youth are the key to making real change. Let's pour positivity, love and music into them and build better communities."

LOUIS SALGAR LEGACY AWARD KEVIN PEREZ



This award is given annually to the Miami student who most exemplifies Louis Salgar's ability to elevate the lives of people around him through his unmistakable passion, uncompromising drive, infectious sense of humor, and positive attitude.

At just 18 years old, Kevin Perez is already on the path to a promising career as a professional guitarist—a journey that began only two and a half years ago when he joined Guitars Over Guns without knowing how to play a single note. Through GOGO, Kevin found more than just an introduction to music; he discovered a passion that would shape his future. It was during a high school session with GOGO that Kevin and a group of peers formed the band The Atomic Lollipops. The mentorship and encouragement Kevin has received through GOGO didn't just teach him how to play an instrument—it provided him with a support system that fueled his determination to pursue music as a career. "I don't know if I would have ended up having such a passion for music and guitar without GOGO," Kevin reflects. One of Kevin's proudest achievements came when he was accepted into the prestigious Interlochen Arts Camp—a milestone made even more impressive by the fact that it followed a severe injury to his left hand, requiring eight stitches. Despite this setback, Kevin's dedication never wavered. His perseverance through challenges is a testament to the resilience, dedication, and positive spirit that make Kevin a respected peer at school, in GOGO, and beyond.

THE HITMAKERS GUITARS OVER GUNS AT





At Overtown Youth Center (OYC), our future pop stars originated their own fresh and youthful twist on the RnB genre. Mentors Julian Munro and Ronnie V. guide students along a transformative musical journey, inspiring our young artists to explore their self-expression through songwriting and production.

A staple of Miami's historic Overtown neighborhood, OYC is a hub for community empowerment and enrichment. In partnership with the Playing for Change Foundation and DJ Khaled's We The Best Foundation, OYC reached out to Guitars Over Guns to envision growing a music program at the center's state of the art music studio facility. With a program launch in December 2023, GOGO hired and trained dedicated mentors in our trauma-informed curriculum, who now facilitate OYC programming both after-school and during the summer for middle and high school youth.

During GOGO's summer camp at OYC, students created original RnB songs that appeal to kids like themselves. From learning production with Julian to singing their hearts out with Ronnie, students encouraged one another through what Ronnie describes as "friendly competition." He recalls this dynamic as a "great way to see how badly the kids wanted to prove themselves from all levels of confidence and musical experience." From brainstorming to songwriting, recording, and feedback, Julian and Ronnie emboldened students with the confidence to collaborate and let their true voices shine. This process culminated in the creation of the two catchiest hits of the summer: "All I Do" and "Future Role Model."

Performing their original songs at OYC's final summer showcase further drove students to shine and reflect on the impact of their newfound GOGO family. By the way the songs captivated the showcase's young audience, "you would've thought a celebrity walked in," recalls Julian. This fun atmosphere and the success of GOGO's OYC program opens the door for an exciting future, with students' musical growth and Julian and Ronnie's powerful mentorship culminating for an unforgettable summer highlight.



GROWING OUR REACH IN CHICAGO

Guitars Over Guns has experienced significant growth in the Chicago region, expanding our reach to serve more students and communities than ever before. Since our launch in 2014 as a team of one, we've grown to a full-time team of nine, with five new team members hired in the last year alone. The need to grow our team highlights the depth of opportunities in Chicago to engage with different communities through our music and mentorship programs and the critical impact of our partnerships. Over the past decade, we've served over 4,000 Chicago students, demonstrating the ongoing need for our work in the city's most underserved neighborhoods.



This expansion has been driven by increased demand for youth mentorship, allowing us to partner with more schools and community organizations, including the Rusu-McCartin Boys & Girls Club, Waukegan High School Brookside, William H. Brown STEM Magnet School, CICS Prairie, Chicago Collegiate High School, and the Juvenile Probation Program at TASC. The results have been inspiring, as we are able to connect more youth, families, school administrators, and community members to opportunities for access to music, building confidence and developing essential life skills.



The growth we've experienced is a powerful reminder of what can be achieved when a community comes together with a shared mission. Looking ahead, Guitars Over Guns remains committed to deepening our impact in Chicago, continuing to provide safe, creative spaces for young people to express themselves, build leadership skills, and find their voice.



A DIFFERENT OUTLOOK IN LIFE

HOW GOGO IS USING MUSIC & MENTORSHIP TO IMPACT JUSTICE-INVOLVED YOUTH







Too often, youth involved in the justice system have stories told about them, but don't always have the chance to tell their own story. In 2023 - 24, with the support of the Marx Fund, GOGO piloted a program at the Juvenile Electronic Monitoring Program at the TASC Reporting Center, working with 39 Cook County juvenile probation clients. Our mentors guided them to learn skills in songwriting, rap, and music production, ensuring the presence of caring, dedicated adults in their lives while creating safe spaces for them to express themselves, tell their stories, and improve their self-esteem.

Youth involved in the justice system face an increased risk of adult incarceration, decreased likelihood of high school graduation, and worsening of mental health. "Many of our youth lack strong social support and resources to help them navigate difficult circumstances," says Angela Blunt, Reporting Center Supervisor. "The TASC Reporting Center believes that having Guitar Over Guns here teaching music twice a week benefits them in the most fundamental way."

Our partnership with TASC presents a unique, challenging, but very rewarding program for GOGO mentors. Due to the nature of the program, mentees will come and go from the

program on unpredictable schedules, placing a premium on building trusting relationships quickly and building a space that the mentees want to keep coming back to.

To hear it from our mentees, the impact couldn't be clearer. "It makes me look at a different outlook in life when it comes to changing myself and changing my decisions," says James, a TASC mentee. "Really, I see Guitars Over Guns as a way to express myself," adds another mentee, Elijah. "Before I got into music production I didn't know what I wanted to do. [My mentors] Ron and Dolan helped me figure out what I wanted to do, and it helped me work with other people a little better."

This program addresses GOGO's belief that every child deserves equitable access to a fair shot in life, the opportunity to self-actualize, and contribute meaningfully to society. "Guitar Over Guns assists the TASC Reporting Center in redirecting our youth to a more constructive manner of expressing themselves, identifying inherent skills that they possess, and how it can benefit them in making the positive changes required to be a productive citizen," says Angela. We couldn't be prouder of this partnership and of our mentees for taking the mic and telling their authentic stories.

His curiosity for new sounds brought him to the California Institute of the Arts, where he completed his Master's program. In an open and creative environment, he refined his skills and shaped his own voice. He started composing and producing his own songs. Through his sensitivity to melodies and understanding of rhythm, Lucas is creating a music full of colors, groove and soul, that is grounded in traditions yet refreshing and innovative.

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



Over the past year, our M-Power Mental Health and Wellness program has experienced remarkable growth and expansion across all regions, underscoring the evergrowing need for comprehensive support services for both youth and mentors.

A major leap forward for the program has been the expansion of our team. We've welcomed a dedicated M-Power Regional Manager in Chicago, bolstering our presence and deepening our impact in the region. Additionally, we've increased the number of Wellness Mentors across all regions, while expanding the program in Miami to include a record number of interns. These critical additions enable us to provide more holistic, wrap-around care, ensuring our youth receive support that goes far beyond music and mentorship.

This school year, we've further honed our M-Power curriculum, enhancing its ability to foster positive youth development and healing through intentional dialogue and community-building. Our front-line mentors now lead dynamic, interactive sessions using circle-keeping lesson plans, incorporating powerful opening and closing circles. With a variety of engaging exercises at their disposal, mentors guide their mentees through reflective practices that deepen connection and promote personal growth.

In keeping with our mission, all mentors and staff across the country have received rigorous training in Youth Mental Health First Aid, equipping them with the skills to address and support the mental health needs of the young people they mentor.

From its inception, M-Power has been seamlessly integrated into every aspect of Guitars Over Guns, ensuring that mental health and wellness are central to our mission. By continuously evolving our training, expanding our team, and designing thoughtful, interactive programming, we are better prepared than ever to support our youth on their journey toward resilience and personal growth.

Guitars Over Guns' M-Power program is powered by the Florida Blue Foundation, with additional support from United Way Miami and Zephyr Impact.
